The Ten Commandments

Three key ideas for you and your children to remember this week:

- 1. The Ten Commandments are a gift from God to the people of Israel and to all human beings to live good lives as we enter in relationship with God and with others.
- 2. The first 3 Commandments refer directly to our relationship with God. They provide the context for the others. We do everything because we love God above everything. The other 7 commandments refer directly to our relationship with our sisters and brothers.
- 3. These are the Ten Commandments. Read them several times and memorize them with your children this week:
 - 1. I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.
 - 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
 - 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
 - 4. Honor your father and your mother.
 - 5. You shall not kill.
 - 6. You shall not commit adultery.
 - 7. You shall not steal.
 - 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
 - 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
 - 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods
